





## Outdoor Challenge Badge

Requirement Number 5: Point out and name five different types of animal, insect, bird or fish that you might find near where you live. Find out about the food they eat and the places they might live.

	<p>Name: A Peacock butterfly. The pattern on the wings looks like eyes and should scare away predators so they don't get eaten!</p> <p>I saw this one in my garden on a sunny day in March, but they do survive most of the year in the UK. They usually live in woodland and when they close their wings they look like a dead leaf. It's a really good camouflage to help them hide.</p> <p>They feed from the nectar in pollen on blossom and flowers. They lay their eggs on nettles and that's where the caterpillars start their lives. 	<p>Name: A Bee-fly Found in the southern part of Britain in gardens and woodland from March to the end of May. They feed on the nectar from flowers. Although they look like they could hurt they do not sting or bite and are harmless to humans.</p>
